
I think this school trip was amazing and I hope that this festival will be organized next year too.

Some famous traditional products are cherry tomatoes, fava, caper and "hlorotyri", a special kind of fresh goat cheese.

Chios



Chios is the fifth largest of the Greek islands, situated in the Aegean Sea, 7 kilometers off the Anatolian coast. The island is separated from Turkey by the Chios Strait. Chios is notable for its exports of mastic gum and its nickname is *the Mastic Island*. Tourist attractions include its medieval villages and the 11th-century monastery of *Nea Moni*, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Administratively, the island forms a separate municipality within the Chios regional unit, which is part of the North Aegean region. The principal town of the island and seat of the municipality is Chios.^[2] Locals refer to Chios town as "Chora" ("Χώρα" literally means land or country, but usually refers to the capital or a settlement at the highest point of a Greek island).

It was also the site of the Chios massacre in which tens of thousands of Greeks on the island were killed by Ottoman troops during the Greek War of Independence in 1822.

Santorini



Santorini is an island in the southern Aegean Sea, and it is the remnant of

a volcanic caldera. It forms the southernmost member of the Cyclades group of islands. Santorini is essentially what remains after an enormous volcanic eruption that destroyed the earliest settlements on a formerly single island, and created the current geological caldera. A giant central, rectangular lagoon, which measures about 12 by 7 km, is surrounded by 300 m high, steep cliffs on three sides.^[4] The main island slopes downward to the Aegean Sea. On the fourth side, the lagoon is separated from the sea by another much smaller island called Therasia; the lagoon is connected to the sea in two places, in the northwest and southwest. The island's principal port is Athinios. The capital, Fira, clings to the top of the cliff looking down on the lagoon.

It is the most active volcanic centre in the South Aegean Volcanic Arc, though what remains today is chiefly a water-filled caldera. The volcanic arc is approximately 500 km long and 20 to 40 km wide. The region first became volcanically active around 3-4 million years ago, though volcanism on Thera began around 2 million years ago with the extrusion of dacitic lavas from vents around the Akrotiri.

Ithaca



Ithaca is located in the Ionian Sea, off the northeast coast of Kefalonia and to the west of continental Greece.

Ithaca's main island has an area of 96 square kilometres. It is the second-smallest of seven main Ionian Islands, after Paxi. The capital is Vathy (or Vathi).

Modern Ithaca is generally identified with Homer's Ithaca, the home of Odysseus, whose delayed return to the island is the plot of the classical Greek tale the *Odyssey*.

Alonnisos

Alonnisos is a Greek island in the Aegean Sea. After Skiathos and Skopelos it is the third member of the Northern Sporades.



The village of Alonnisos is located on the southern part of the island. It is locally known as Chora and signposted as The Old Village. The main port of the island is located in the southeast and is called Patitiri. The bay at the southern end of the island is also called Alonnisos.

The Municipality of Alonnisos includes the nearby islands of Adelfoi, Gioura, Kyra Panagia (Pelagos), Peristera, Piperi, Psathoura and Skantzoura.

When ice melted on Earth, humans had to find ways to survive, so they created cities beneath the water. We are presenting you one of them, New Subatlantis.




Futureland will be much different than our city today. It will have smart houses and you will be able to give orders to the house, like: "Turn on the lights" and it will react.

Griechenland: Land der Inseln, wie von Götterhand ins Meer gestreut.



Die Wiege Europas betört die Sinne mit blühenden Zitrusbäumen, duftendem Thymian, zirpenden Zikaden im Olivenhain - dazwischen tausendjährige Ruinen: Fundamente der abendländischen Kultur. Von Athen, dem Zentrum des antiken Denkens, über das vulkanische Santorin oder das blendend weisse Mykonos reiht sich eine Perle an die nächste. Das Meer erstreckt sich tiefblau bis zum Horizont. Pittoreske Dörfer schmiegen sich an die Hügel. Mediterrane Delikatessen unter freiem Himmel kosten, gefolgt von einem Glas eiskalten Ouzos. Sich Zeit nehmen: für Gespräche, für fröhliches Beisammensein, für Genuss und Spiel. Griechenland ist mehr als ein Land - es ist ein Lebensgefühl.

Kosmopolitische Atmosphäre, eine schillernde Barszene, ausgelassene Strandpartys - auf Mykonos trifft sich im Sommer der internationale Jetset und macht die Nacht zum Tag.

In der hübschen Altstadt von Mykonos-Stadt laden zahllose Restaurants, Bars, Strassencafés und Geschäfte zum Bummeln und Feiern ein. An den berühmten Stränden Paradise und Super Paradise tanzen

Feierfreudige bis die Sonne aufgeht und an den Häfen reihen sich die Luxusyachten. Malerische Städte wie Chania oder Rethymnon mit pittoresken Gassen und gemütlichen Tavernen, sowie ein reges Nachtleben, etwa in Chersonissos oder Malia, runden die kretische Vielfalt ab.

Korfu hat viele Gesichter: Traditionelle Bergdörfer, idyllische Lagunen und unerschlossene Küstenstreifen finden sich neben Touristenstränden mit breitem Unterhaltungsangebot.



Die Einflüsse der verschiedenen Eroberer prägen die Insel: In Korfu-Stadt etwa haben die Italiener prächtige venezianische Gebäude hinterlassen, die Briten einen Palast aus maltesischem Kalkstein und die Franzosen elegante Arkaden. Kaiserin Elisabeth von Österreich, bekannt als «Sissi», liebte diese Insel. In ihrem Schloss südwestlich von Korfu-Stadt erholte sie sich jeweils vom anstrengenden Leben am Hof.

Kassandra, Sithonia und Athos ragen weit ins Meer: Drei schmale, lange Finger an der Hand von Chalkidiki. Halbinseln — gleich geformt, von unterschiedlichem Format.

Kassandra, die touristisch Entwickelte; mit endlos, langen Sandstränden und einem grossen Angebot für Nachtschwärmer; Sithonia, die wilde Schöne; mit überwältigender Natur und kleinen, versteckten Buchten. Athos, die ruhige Würdevolle; grösste Mönchsrepublik in Europa und nur erwachsenen Männern vorbehalten. Egal für welche Region Sie sich entscheiden: Das Meer präsentiert sich türkisblau und kristallklar, vielfach ausgezeichnet mit der «Blauen Flagge» für hervorragende Wasserqualität.



Grün, blühend, fruchtbar — Kos trägt den Beinamen «schwimmender Garten» nicht umsonst. Von Tamarisken, die Salzwasser vertragen, über üppig blühenden Oleander und duftenden Thymian bis zu Granatapfelbäumen gedeiht auf Kos alles.

Die Inselhauptstadt Kos-Stadt, überragt von einer Kreuzritterburg, ist berühmt für ihr reges Nachtleben: Besonders im Altstadtviertel zwischen dem Mandraki-Hafen und dem antiken Marktplatz reihen sich Discos, Bars und Tavernen, die sich häufig erst nach Mitternacht füllen. Doch Kos'

grösstes Kapital sind die traumhaften Sandstrände: flach, feinsandig, kilometerlang – dazu kommt eine perfekt ausgebaute Ferieninfrastruktur und ein breites Wassersportangebot.

Die Insel in der östlichen Ägäis ist bekannt für ihren süssen Wein, die Naturbuchten mit Sand- und Kieselstränden und die malerischen Hafenstädtchen. Historischem begegnen Sie hier ebenso: Eines der Hauptheiligtümer der Göttin Hera befand sich auf Samos.



Süsser Muskateller-Wein, aromatisches Olivenöl, frische Meeresfrüchte – auf Samos kommt der Genuss bestimmt nicht zu kurz. Dabei bleibt viel Zeit zum Nachdenken. Kein Wunder, hat Samos zahlreiche Philosophen sowie den berühmten Mathematiker Pythagoras hervorgebracht. Die malerischen Weinberge, Pinienwälder und ursprünglichen Dörfer laden zu herrlichen Wanderungen ein. Und natürlich sind da noch die flach abfallenden Strände, die Samos zur Badeferieninsel prädestinieren: weitläufig, familienfreundlich – traumhaft.

Santorini, eine Insel für Ästheten und Weinliebhaber: Schwarze Strände, blaue Dächer, weissgetünchte Häuser und – vulkanischer Boden: Beste Grundlage für einen Spitzenwein, der seinesgleichen sucht.

An der Ostküste ziehen sich sanft abfallende, fruchtbare Ebenen bis an die schwarzen Strände hin. Im Westen, hoch oben am Rand der Kraterwand, legen sich malerische Dörfer, etwa Imerovigli oder Oia, wie weisse Bänder an den Fels. Die Häuser sind auf inseltypische Art in den Fels gehauen, weissgetüncht und mit Treppen verbunden. Würdevoll thront das Wahrzeichen Santorinis, die Kirche Agíos Minás mit ihren

weissen Mauern und leuchtend blauen Kuppeln über dem Meer.

«Blume des Ostens» nannten die Venezianer Zakyntos. Über 400 Jahre besetzten sie die Insel und gaben sie nur ungern wieder her. Kein Wunder: So grün wie Zakyntos ist kaum eine griechische Insel.

Ihre malerischen Bergdörfer, fruchtbaren Ebenen und vor allem die goldfarbenen Sandstrände verleihen der Insel paradiesische Reize. Das richtige Umfeld, um das Leben zu geniessen. Nachtschwärmer zieht es an den herrlichen Sandstrand in der Bucht von Laganas. Doch der Strand ist nicht nur bei Menschen beliebt: Er gilt auch als einer der wichtigsten Mittelmeer-Brutplätze der Unechten Kareschildkröte, die im beeindruckenden Meeresnationalpark vor Zakyntos' Küste leben.

An einem Strand des Peloponnes stand einst Pelops, Namensgeber der Halbinsel und Günstling der Götter, und rief Poseidon um Hilfe. Der Herrscher der Meere sandte seine Pferde aus den Fluten, um dem Flehenden zu helfen.



War es in Nafplion? In Skafidia? Auf dem Peloponnes wandeln Sie überall auf mythologischen Spuren. Strände, Schluchten, Berge – Kulisse für jahrtausendealte Legenden. Olympia, Korinth, Mykene – Überreste antiker Hochkultur. Klassisches Altertum und moderner Hotelluxus, sonnige Strandtage und historische Ausflüge – diese Mischung bestimmt Ihre Ferientage.

Zu Recht zählt sie mit ihren über 3000 Sonnenstunden im Jahr, kilometerlangen Sandstränden und den türkisfarbenen Buchten zu den Sonne, Sand und Meer prägen

das Image der Insel Rhodos. attraktivsten Badedestinationen Europas.



Doch Rhodos hat noch viel mehr zu bieten: eine mittelalterliche Festungsstadt etwa, Weltkulturerbe der UNESCO. Die Stadtmauern von Rhodos-Stadt umschliessen architektonische Meisterwerke und eine geheimnisvolle Stimmung.
